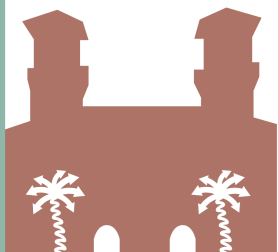

**Description:** The biennial Chemical Protein Synthesis (CPS) Meeting is an international gathering of scientists with interests in protein chemistry broadly defined, from synthetic methodology to applications in medicine and materials. The 2015 conference follows a highly successful meeting held in Vienna in 2013 (*ChemBioChem*, **2013**, 1381-1384; <http://dx.doi.org/10.1002/cbic.201300337>).
